CAPITAL GRANT PROGRAMS AVAILABLE FOR FACILITY-RELATED IMPROVEMENTS

The legislature has appropriated funding in the 2017-2019 Capital Budget for facility-related grants to school districts. Each appropriation has a specific use and amount of funding, as well as unique minimum criteria to be used for grant award purposes.

School Facility and Organization staff will host a ZOOM webinar on **May 15, 2018 from 1-2 p.m.** Staff will present details about each of the 7 programs as well as schedules for application and award. A 10 minute Q&A session will follow the presentation.

Program Reapproval Update

As a reminder, the program reapproval system does not automatically generate an email when a program is approved, or sent back to the district for modifications. Districts will want to log in and check each program area to determine next steps. Once a program has been approved, the district should print the signature page for their records. The priority for the CTE office program supervisor staff is to process all program reapproval applications, and then staff will proceed processing course approvals. The most common issues requiring response from districts include the following items:

System:

1. The application includes duplicated courses under the same name and same CIP code as “still offered”
2. Courses are marked as state equivalencies, when the CIP code does not have an equivalency framework

3. Row data is incomplete: required fields are not selected or completed

Advisory Committee:

1. Courses included in the program application are not reflected in the advisory minutes
2. Advisory minutes do not reflect employment projection or occupational demand was reviewed as a component of approval

Extended Leadership/Learning:

1. A CTSO or equivalency is selected in the row data, but no corresponding uploaded evidence is provided
2. The uploaded documentation does not demonstrate affiliation, correspond with leadership options selected, or there is a lack of leadership alignment entirely

Any districts that failed to submit the program reapproval applications by deadline need to submit course applications for the CTE courses that were not included.

Applied Math

Reminder! If a district is offering CTE Applied Math, the teacher must complete the Washington Applied Math Council training before offering the course. To be approved to offer the course for CTE funding, teachers must successfully complete Initial Training and the Fall and Spring In-services offered in the school year following Initial Training.

After meeting the teacher requirements for Initial Applied Math approval expressed above, the teacher must attend either a WAMC/OSPI Summer Conference Training at least once every five years, or accumulate a total of forty clock hours by attending the Fall/Spring one-day In-service over a five-year period to acquire continued approval.

Teachers with a conditional, probationary, initial or continuing CTE certificate can teach this course, as long as the training requirement is met.

Applied Math Grant Opportunity

The Office of Superintendent of Public Instruction is able to provide 30 Perkins Reserve eligible Career and Technical Education teachers with a grant of \$500 to attend the Washington Applied Math Council Summer Conference. Project Lead the Way

Registration for Summer Core Training is underway in WA State and across the country – go to <https://www.pltw.org/our-programs/professional-development> for more information. Several courses are also available as Online Core Training during the school year - high school courses include Introduction to Engineering Design (IED), Principles of Biomedical Science (PBS), Computer Science Essentials (CSE). Online Gateway Middle School units include Design and Modeling (DM), Computer Science for Innovators and Creators (CSIM), App Creators (AC), and Medical Detectives (MD).

The Gateway Medical Detectives unit has been completely re-written for the 2018-19 school year. Current MD teachers will find an “Update” training in their myPLTW account. New MD teachers will experience an all new Core Training experience.

PLTW is now a partner with TEALS, which means that a high school who uses PLTW CS curriculum can also be part of the TEALS volunteer partnership, or vice versa. This combines PLTW’s great teacher core training (PD) with follow-up support in the classroom for up to 2 years – wow! Be sure to register with TEALS if you want to be included in this partnership.

Beginning in 2018-19, PLTW will be hosting several regional “Summits” around the country. The West Region will be in California – date TBA. This will be an excellent opportunity for current PLTW teachers to experience ongoing professional development and for new districts/schools to learn about PLTW and network with existing teachers.
